COMPETITION GUIDELINES

Eligibility

Any high school senior slated to graduate in 2024. This competition includes public and private schools as well as home-schooled students.

Artwork Theme

The theme of this competition is “**What I Dream of for My Future**” and should be a visual depiction of where the student sees themselves five to ten years after they graduate. If words are used in the artwork, they should be kept to a minimum.

Judging and Winners

- A panel of judges will review all entries and select a winner from each of the following categories:

1. **Painting and Drawing**
2. **Digital Art**
3. **Stained Glass, Mosaic, Ceramics**

- In addition to the winners for each category, one overall “Best of Show” winner will be selected.

- Prizes are as follows:

First place in each category will receive a **\$500** award amount.

“**Best of Show**” will receive a **\$1000** award amount.

Judging Criteria

1. Interpretation and clarity of theme
2. Creativity and originality of theme
3. Quality of artistic composition & design
4. Overall impression of art

Accepted Mediums

Any of the following mediums or techniques may be used:

- **Painting** (watercolor, acrylic, gouache, oil, pastels, etc.)
- **Drawing** (graphite, charcoal, Conté crayon, colored pencil, markers, pen & ink, etc.)
- **Original digital illustrations**
- **Three-dimensional pieces** (stained glass, mosaic, ceramics)

Size Requirements

- Wall art is not to exceed 30” x 30” and must be **FRAMED** (under glass or stretched canvas), **WIRED FOR HANGING**, and suitable for public display.
- Projects should not exceed 25 pounds in weight.

Multiple Entries

Up to two entries per student may be submitted, from one or multiple categories.

Submissions

Visit **ASPIRINGARTISTAWARD.com**, complete the on-line application and submit. Download a copy of the application, fill out and securely attach the form to your art before entering your project.

Deadline for Entries

All entries are to be delivered to the **First United Methodist Church**, 52 N. Main St, London, OH 43140. Dates for delivery **January 4, 1-3pm** or **January 5 & 6, 10am-12noon (FINAL DEADLINE)**. Enter through the door off the back parking lot near the garage marked OFFICES / DELIVERIES. More signage will be posted inside of church.

Award Announcement

Awards will be announced and artwork will be displayed during the **Young Artist Showcase** which begins at 3pm on **Sunday, January 21, 2024**. This event will take place at **First United Methodist Church**, 52 N. Main St, London, OH 43140. This showcase is held annually and is sponsored by the Madison County Arts Council. A reception for all artists will follow the performance. All art entries for this contest will also be exhibited the month of February at **London City Hall**, 20 S. Walnut St, London, OH 43140. Students may pick up their art at City Hall on **February 29, 8am-4pm**. See Amy Rees (Exec Admin), Suite 100, to claim art. Best of luck to all our competitors!
